Semester 1

The Arts:

Media –

Manipulating Image and Time in film

\$52

Refine filmmaking techniques using slow motion, fast forward and freeze frames to create intriguing transitions in a short film production. In this hands-on class you will go behind the scenes to learn about the exciting world of film production and learn how producers manipulate images and film sequences. Use photoshop to manipulate images and explore the influential world of advertising. 2D Art -

Mix It Up!

Artist block? Do you ever want to make art but not know what medium to work with? Why draw when you can paint...or why paint when you can print. In this 2D mixed media course you never have to choose just one because you can work with them all! Explore collage, printmaking, ink and wash, drawing AND painting, all of the things to create mixed media and experimental artworks.

3D Art –

Functional Ceramics

Pottery has been used for functional purposes since the beginning of civilisation. Using clay, you will explore different methods of constructing everyday pots and vessels, including an introductory course on throwing using the potter's wheel. In this unit you will focus on the functional uses of pottery making useful items such as a mug and plate, noodle bowls, platters or even a candle holder! You will have opportunities to explore different methods of surface design and specialist glazes because let's face it, we all want our mugs to be cute!

HASS:

Horticulture – Living off the Land

In Horticulture, students will explore the intensive cultivation of plants for food, with a strong focus on growing vegetables, fruits, and herbs in a sustainable way. Using the school's community garden as a hands-on learning space, students will learn about soil preparation, plant propagation, composting, and environmentally friendly gardening practices. They will develop practical skills in growing, harvesting, and maintaining edible plants while also exploring the importance of food security, nutrition, and sustainable agriculture in Australia.

Health & Physical Education:

AFL

This course is designed to provide students with opportunities to extend their skills and knowledge as an elite performer in the sport of AFL. Students will have various opportunities in a mostly practical setting to develop an in-depth understanding of some of the requirements of an elite performer in terms of fitness training, AFL draft testing, sports nutrition, skill and tactical knowledge and skill development and advancement.

Netball

This course is designed to provide students with opportunities to extend their skills, knowledge, and fitness in the widely popular sport of netball. Students will have various opportunities in both a practical and theory-based setting to develop an in-depth understanding of the game of netball. Fitness is a major aspect of this course; students will participate in one fitness lesson per week. The fitness program may include circuit training, Tabata, strength and conditioning and yoga.

Languages other than English (LOTE):

Japanese – Full Year Course

Studying a foreign language offers many benefits, including improved critical thinking, memory, and self-confidence, as well as stronger literacy in a student's first language. By comparing the structures of English and Japanese, students develop transferable skills that support learning across subjects, real-life situations, and future career pathways.

At Eaton Community College, all students in Years 7 and 8 study Japanese. The program gives students opportunities to engage with culture, history, and authentic language use through excursions, incursions, and overseas trips. Students also enjoy hands-on cultural activities such as calligraphy, Japanese cooking, origami, and traditional games, which bring the language and culture to life.

From Year 9 onwards, students are encouraged to continue their Japanese studies. The program extends their knowledge with more complex grammar, kanji, and longer conversations, with an emphasis on practical communication and cultural understanding. Students gain increasing confidence in using Japanese in real-world contexts, preparing them for further study in senior school.

A highlight for Year 9 students is the Setagaya excursion program. As part of this initiative, Eaton Community College students visited the Bunbury Wildlife Park to take part in a language and cultural exchange with visiting students from Bunbury's sister city, Setagaya (Tokyo). This provides a memorable opportunity for both groups to practise language skills, share cultural perspectives, and build international friendships.

Food & Fibre Production:

Caring for Children

\$75

Do you enjoy interacting with young children, or are interested in childcare or teaching? This course is suitable for new and continuing childcare students. In this course students develop an understanding of a caring for young children aged from one to five years of age. Students gain knowledge and skills in how to meet their needs and promote development. Students also explore responsibilities, safety requirements and how technology has impacted on how we care for children. Practically, students will use a variety of equipment, materials and techniques to create a varied selection of items to meet the needs of a child.

Digital Technologies:

Game Design

Introducing new skills, as well as building on the skills gained in Digital Creation, this course will use increasingly advanced development environments such as:

- Unity, Phaser, and Visual Studio to work towards 3D apps and games as well as websites with increasing functionality.
- 3D design and creation skills will be investigated further, using real world tools such as Fusion 360 and Slic3r.
- Grow your skills and experience and help better understand computing and technological roles that exist in the world.

Food Specialisation:

Café Culture

Cafe culture refers to the social and economic aspects of coffee shops, encompassing everything from the ambiance and design to the types of coffee and snacks offered. It's a place where people meet, socialize, work, and enjoy a cup of their favourite beverage in a unique environment. Join our class to learn styling techniques, secret recipes and an introduction into the hospitality industry. Students will explore local menus and replicate dishes as well as creating their own recipes. A Certificate II in Hospitality is offered at Eaton Community College for Year 11 + 12 students, should you wish to further your skills and knowledge.

Materials Technology Specialisation:

Textiles

\$80

Ready to turn your passion for fashion into practical skills? This course provides the foundation for beginner fashion sewing. You'll learn to use specialized equipment to design and construct garments, master essential sewing and alteration techniques, and develop a portfolio showcasing your design abilities.

Students will be introduced to the world of creative sewing. Each project created during this course will have specific construction challenges. These projects will advance in level as the students achieve their new skills. Each student will progress at their own pace meeting set benchmarks as they go. Upon completion students will have acquired the skills needed to follow a commercial pattern and tailor their garments to meet their need.

Engineering Principles:

Electronics

The Year 10 Engineering Electronics Course is an engaging, hands-on program designed for students interested in the principles of electronics and engineering. This semester-long course aligns with the Western Australian Curriculum for Technologies, providing a comprehensive introduction to both theoretical concepts and practical applications in the field of electronics. Explore the basics of electricity, circuits, and components such as resistors, capacitors, and transistors. Gain hands-on experience with soldering techniques to assemble circuit boards and electronic devices safely.

Health & Physical Education:



Outdoor Education

The Outdoor Education program develops character and skills in students through the promotion of self-reliance, leadership, teamwork, responsibility, healthy risk-taking, communal living and environmental care. The course provides students with an opportunity to learn essential outdoor skills and experience outdoor activities. Students will demonstrate these skills across a variety of off-site camp and expedition-type activities across the semester. Activities may include:

- Swimming
- Snorkelling
- Kayaking
- Orienteering/recreational walking to Collie River
- Cycling
- Cooking with a Trangia First aid development
- Day camps & Overnight camps
- Teambuilding excursions

Students who select this subject:

- Should have achieved a minimum C grade in general Physical Education.

- Should have a high standard of behaviour and responsibility and only those students who are willing to participate fully are encouraged to select this course.

Basketball

Students will have various opportunities in both a practical and theory-based setting to develop an in-depth understanding of tactical game play, technical skills required for basketball, fitness programming, sports nutrition, umpiring and coaching.

- Have a high standard of behaviour, be responsible and be willing to participate fully in all activities.

Design:

Graphic Design

\$52

Using DSLR cameras, learn how to set up beautiful images and capture the perfect moment. Use the rules of composition and design principles to create distinctive images. Then, learn to manipulate images, create logos, posters and other cool visual designs that combines different elements.

Develop your skills in Adobe Photoshop to fine tune your images; learn how to overlay and blend different images together to create stunning images then use those images for artistic or commercial purposes.

2D Art –

Street Art & Printmaking

Ever feel like you need to make your mark on the world? In this 2D printmaking unit you will explore the different methods for creating repeatable artworks using printmaking, stencils and spray paint. Explore the rise of stencil printing and look at artists like Banksy who uses his artwork to send social and political messages. Explore art making using linocut printing and stencil printing. Create your own sprayed stencil mural about a topic that is important to you.

3D Art –

Recycled Sculpture, trash or treasure

Art making doesn't need to involve pencils and paint – recycled objects, found objects, even the natural spaces around us can be used to make art. Inspiration is everywhere around us – sometimes it is in nature or sometimes it's the junk left behind. In Trash or Treasure, you will explore environmental art and work on sculptural pieces using trash, recycled and upcycled objects to create installation pieces. Learn sculptural techniques and work with unconventional materials to turn that trash into treasure – with a message about sustainability.

HASS:**Conservation – Sustaining Life****\$50**

In Conservation, students build on their horticulture knowledge by linking food production with conservation and land management practices. Conservation studies draw on scientific disciplines such as ecology, biodiversity, wildlife biology, and genetics to understand and protect living organisms and ecosystems. Students will explore how sustainable land management supports both food production and environmental health, valuing the balance required when living off the land.

Food Specialisation:**Barista****\$150**

This hands-on semester-long course equips students with the essential skills and knowledge to achieve their VET units of competency for Barista employment.

Students will learn the art of espresso making, including milk frothing techniques, hygiene and safety practices, and how to prepare a full café-style menu of hot beverages using our industry-standard coffee machine in the school's teaching café.

Through practical lessons and guided practice, students will build confidence and consistency in coffee preparation. By the end of the course, students will be well-prepared to seek employment as a Barista or continue their hospitality training by entering the Certificate II in Hospitality in Year 11, with some units already completed.

Street Food**\$95**

In this interactive cooking class, you'll learn to prepare your own authentic street food creations, from classic dishes to hidden gems. Our experienced chef will guide you through each step, revealing insider tips and tricks to elevate your cooking. Get ready to tantalize your tastebuds, build your culinary confidence, and share a delicious meal with your friends. This class is the perfect class for anyone who loves to eat and learn.

Baking**\$90**

Unlock your inner baker! This hands-on class will guide you through the fundamentals of baking, from mastering essential techniques to creating delicious and impressive treats. Learn to perfect your cakes, breads, and pastries while building confidence in the kitchen. Whether you're a beginner or looking to refine your skills, this class is your recipe for success. Take the time out of life's daily stresses to enjoy learning new cooking skills.

Materials Technology Specialisation:**Wood****\$127**

During this course students will learn to combine a range of characteristics and properties of materials, components and equipment to create a solution to a coffee table design problem. Students will complete safety training on a number of workshop machines before being required to use them to produce their design. They will apply design thinking and creativity to develop, modify and communicate design ideas before planning the production of their preferred design.
